

RIME section report 18 Feb 2002

The RIME section is sponsoring a session at the annual meeting on Informed Consent for Curriculum Research: When Do Medical Students Become Human Subjects? (Rebecca Henry, PhD, Michigan State University and Brian Mavis, PhD, Michigan State University); and a workshop on Why Reviewers Accept or Reject Manuscripts. Would Yours Pass? (Georges Bordage, MD PhD, University of Illinois at Chicago). The RIME section is collaborating with GME to sponsor a MERE Session entitled Assessing ACGME Competencies (Larry Gruppen, PhD, University of Michigan and Janet Riddle, MD, Rush Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center). There are also two facilitated poster sessions, two RIME paper sessions of 5 papers each, and a session of three roundtables.

The RIME section is particularly interested in close collaboration with the UGME section to help define research skills that are included in the educator competencies. When these eventually reach the stage of clarity that leads to attempts to teach them to our members (A CME activity?), RIME will be there to help provide relevant content expertise. We are also eager to work with the GME section on assessing those ACGME competencies.
